

James Wood belonged to a family of whom many members were distinguished physicians. Born in 1785, he obtained the degree of MD from Edinburgh University in 1809 and practised in Dundee, then Cupar. In 1821, he moved to Edinburgh with his family, where he continued to practise from his house in Royal Circus. He died in 1865.
