Administration files containing memos, circulars and correspondence regarding the establishment, organisation and administration of the National Radium Centre set up at the Royal Infirmary of Edinburgh in 1929.

Following its nomination by the Faculty of Medicine, the Royal Infirmary of Edinburgh was recognised as a National Radium Centre in 1930 by the National Radium Commission. Having satisfied their requirements in terms of facilities and staffing, the National Radium Commission was prepared to loan Radium to the Infirmary to be used for the treatment (and investigation of treatment) of malignant disease. the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Edinburgh, a Joint Committee between the Royal Infirmary and the Faculty was established
