WAVERLEY CARE TRUST

Waverley Care Trust started as a Lothian Regional Council initiative called the AIDS Residential Accommodation Trust in 1989. Responsibility for the organisation of Trust meetings rested with the Regional Secretary's Department and trustees included the Lord Provost of the City of Edinburgh, the Chairman of Lothian Health Board and the Bishop of Edinburgh. The Trust, working with the Milestone Venture Trust, was responsible for the establishment of a hospice for people with AIDS called Milestone House.

The files were created by Alex Thomson of the Regional Secretary's Department and transferred by David Taylor, Lothian Regional Council's AIDS Co-ordinator.
