Introduction

Alexander Murray Drennan graduated MB ChB from Edinburgh University in 1906. During World War I he served with RAMC, and pioneered the use of a mixture of boric acid and bleaching powder (known as Eusol or Edinburgh University Solution) in the treatment of wounds incurred by British forces in Flanders. He successively held the chairs of pathology at Otago, New Zealand (1914–1928), Queen's University, Belfast (1928–1931), and Edinburgh University (1931–1954).
