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Introduction

The Edinburgh Hospital for Sick Children first opened in 1860 at no 7 Lauriston Lane. It had twenty beds and a dispensary. In 1863 Queen Victoria bestowed upon it her Royal Patronage. In the same year the hospital moved to larger premises in Meadowside House, at the foot of Lauriston Lane. The move doubled its capacity. In 1870 the addition of a new wing increased the number of beds to 72.

In 1890 an outbreak of typhoid fever in the hospital affected several members of staff and caused the death of a nurse. This and other factors made the Directors decide to move the hospital to other premises while Meadowside House was thoroughly examined. They managed to secure the lease of Morningside College at Plewlands.

A thorough inspection revealed that Meadowside House did not have all the necessary facilities for the work of a hospital. The building was demolished and the site sold to the Royal Infirmary. The Directors then purchased the Trades Maiden Hospital at Rillbank, and demolished that building. On the site thus cleared a new children's hospital was built to the designs of G Washington Browne. This, the present Royal Hospital for Sick Children, was formally opened by Princess Beatrice on 31 Oct 1895.

In 1906 the Hospital received the bequest of the estate and house of Muirfield. The existing house was initially used as a Convalescent Home, but it proved to be too small, and so it was demolished and a new Home, built to RS Lorimer's designs, was formally opened on 17 July 1909. It could accommodate 24 patients.

Muirfield Convalescent Home could take children over the age of two. There was a need for a Home for very young children, and this need was met in 1934, thanks to the generosity of Lord Forteviot and the Dewar family. The Directors were able to purchase the house at no 16 Hope Terrace. It was opened on 23 January 1936 by Lord Forteviot and had cots for patients. In 1948 the adjacent house was purchased and the Home extended.

In 1948 the Hospital became part of the Central Hospitals Group under the South East Regional Hospital Board (LHB 29). From 1974–1984 it came under the South Lothian District of Lothian Health Board.

The hospital first opened in 1860 at no 7 Lauriston Lane. In 1863 it moved to Meadowside House at the foot of Lauriston Lane. In December 1890, following a typhoid outbreak, the hospital moved again, this time to Morningside College, Plewlands. Meadowside House was demolished. In 1895 the present hospital at Sciennes Road was opened.

In subsequent years the hospital purchased houses in Rillbank Crescent and Rillbank Terrace. Some were adapted for use by the hospital as consulting rooms and as a nurses' home. Others were leased out to tenants. In 1934 no 16 Hope Park Terrace was purchased and converted into the Forteviot Home for very young children. The hospital also acquired houses in Colinton, Loanhead, etc, which were leased out.

The following documents and correspondence deal with the purchase and maintenance of all the above buildings, except for the maintenance of the main hospital building (see LHB 5/31).

The estate of Muirfield was bequeathed to the Royal Hospital for Sick Children by Miss Mary Jane Meikleham. The existing house opened in May 1906 as a Convalescent Home for ten patients. Accommodation, however, was needed for 16 children with the possibility of extending to take 24. Mr Lorimer, the architect, was consulted and asked to prepare plans. There were two alternatives: to extend the existing building, or to replace it with a new one. The latter course was decided on. The new Home opened on 17 July 1909.

The Muirfield Convalescent Home, situated as it was beside the golf course, was able to benefit from the sale of programmes for the Open Golf Championships held there.
