## Introduction

Within the Lothian region, the South Eastern Regional Hospital Board appointed Group Boards of Management in 1948. The West Lothian Hospitals Board of Management oversaw Bangour General Hospital, Bangour Village Hospital, Bo'ness Hospital, Drumshoreland Hospital, St Michael's Hospital and Tippethill Hospital. Boards of Management were replaced by Districts in 1974.

Symposium – Livingston Health Services – 25 October 1971. Produced by the Health Services Joint Advisory Committee for the Livingston Area, the symposium was intended as an appraisal of general practitioner services in the Livingston area. A number of doctors gave papers on general practice and paediatric, psychiatric, obstetric and geriatric services; record keeping; and training. Acc 06/04.

Bangour History – Typed. Folder of historical information relating to both Bangour General and Bangour Village Hospitals. Contains: typed history divided into Bangour - The Early Years 1904-1914, The War Hospital May 1915-Dec 1921, The Post-War Years – The Twenties (author unknown); handbook for nurses on training available at Bangour General Hospital,c1960; programme for the official opening of the Burn Unit at Bangour General Hospital, 1968; Paper on Work Study in the Hospital Service produced by the National Association of Hospital Management Committee Group Secretaries, 1959; Rules and Regulations for the Management of Linlithgow Combination, 1908 (later St Michael's Hospital); two photographs: a man and a woman visiting a patient in Occupational Therapy, probably at Bangour Village Hospital (PH16/107); a group of four men, with WD Mitchell, Group Engineer, second from left with Bangour Memorial Church in the background (PH16/108).
