Introduction

Edmund Price (1862-1917) was a radiologist at Chalmers Hospital. He graduated from Edinburgh University in 1884 and, after working as a general practitioner, started to specialise in x-radiology in 1906. He tried whenever possible to attend the operations of patients he had x-rayed so therefore became an expert in the accurate interpretation of x-ray plates.
