

Miss Annie Gill first came to the Royal Infirmary as an Assistant Superintendent of Nurses in 1894. In 1900 she went to South Africa as Matron of the Edinburgh and East of Scotland South Africa Hospital. In 1902 she took up an appointment as Matron at the Royal Berkshire Hospital, Reading. She was Lady Superintendent of Nurses at the RIE from 1907 to 1925.
