Margaret Colville Marshall was the first Matron of Beechmount Hospital, which opened in 1932. Later in the 1930s she became Senior Assistant to the Lady Superintendent of Nurses at the Royal Infirmary of Edinburgh. Between 1939 and 1944 she was the first Principal Matron of the Scottish Emergency Hospitals and of the Civil Nursing Reserve and later Chief Nursing Officer of the Department of Health for Scotland. She became Lady Superintendent of Nurses at the RIE in 1944 and retired from that post in 1955. See GN 148 for further information.
