Introduction

The Crusaid charity was founded in 1986, offering support for a better quality of life to HIV-positive individuals in response to the poverty and stigma which often followed from the diagnosis. Adults and children were able to benefit from a variety of grants and innovative projects. The charity also supported research into treatment and possible vaccination against HIV. In association with the Terence Higgins Trust, Crusaid set up the National Hardship Fund, which gave financial help to those living with the virus. In June 2010, a significant budget cut saw Crusaid merge with the Terence Higgins Trust and adopt their branding. The records in this collection relate to Crusaid Scotland, a Scottish division of the charity, which was formed in 1988. Along with Crusaid in the rest of the UK, it ceased to operate after the merger with the Terrence Higgins Trust in 2010. The Terrence Higgins Trust Scotland continues to operate a Crusaid Hardship Fund. The original order of the records has been preserved where possible. Where there is no obvious title to a component of the catalogue, one has been approximated (in square brackets).

1 Crusaid Scotland administration, 1991 – 1998

Files relating to the day-to-day running of the charity. Crusaid Scotland dealt with its own administration, correspondence and finances, but reported regularly to Crusaid Enterprises Limited through regular meetings in London. Very few administrative records were gifted as part of the accession - however, a snapshot of how the company managed its affairs is reflected.

3 Campaigns, committees and working groups, 1990 – 1997

As well as organising events and fundraising activities, Crusaid Scotland also helped to finance, promote and establish various other campaigns, committees and working groups across the country. Groups could apply to Crusaid Scotland for funding, but in many cases Crusaid Scotland also helped with promotion of national campaigns and initiatives that they believed would benefit the charity's aims.

1 Red Ribbon Initiative 1995 – 1997

The Red Ribbon Initiative began in 1991 in New York when a group of artists embarked on a new visual project to help spread awareness of the dangers of HIV and AIDS. Ribbons were designed to be worn as a symbol of solidarity and support for people living with the disease. The red ribbon has now become synonymous with World AIDS Day on 1 December and people across the world are involved in making, distributing and wearing them to show support.

2 Take Care campaign, 1992 – 1993

The Take Care campaign in Edinburgh and the Lothians began in the early 1990s in response to the realisation that cases of HIV in the area were four times the national average, affecting mainly young heterosexual people. The campaign was intended to raise awareness amongst all members of the community, and involved advertising, events, and education. The theme of the campaign encouraged people to 'take care of the one you love'. The campaign was launched and promoted by Lothian Health Board (LHB) and Lothian Regional Council (LRC).

The Names Project Exhibition – AIDS Memorial Quilt, 1991 – 1997

The Names Project began in San Francisco in 1985 both as a memorial to individuals and a way to spread awareness of HIV and AIDS. People could design panels to represent their loved ones and each panel was then sewn together to make a quilt. The UK version of the project began in 1991 and a travelling exhibition was set up to tour Britain showcasing the panels.

4 Diocesan Centre educational resource pack, 1991 – 1992

The Diocese of Edinburgh is one of the seven Dioceses of the Scottish Episcopal Church, part of the world-wide Anglican Communion. In 1991, the Community Education Office of the Diocese developed an education pack on HIV and AIDS from a Christian perspective. Crusaid edited the document and helped with printing costs.

5 <u>Innocent Love working group, 1994 – 1995</u>

Innocent Love was a working group set up in 1994 by the Community Education Service of the Central Regional Council. The group consisted of 12 young women from Denny, Larbert and Stenhousemuir and aimed to develop peer-led HIV and AIDS prevention education for young people. The group disbanded after one year due to lack of funding and members leaving to pursue other avenues of work.

6 Scottish Prostitutes Education Project, 1996

Scottish Prostitutes Education Project (SCOT-PEP) is a registered charity dedicated to the promotion of sex workers' rights, health and dignity. The charity received some funding from Crusaid but was awarded a contract by LHB to run the project in line with LHB aims and objectives. The charity lost the contract after a report put forward that their aims and objectives were different from those of LHB (for more information see GD25 and LHB45). SCOT-PEP is now funded by patrons and public donations.

8 Confidence, Assertion and Negotiating Safer Sex working group (CANSS), 1991

CANSS was established in 1991 by Maureen Bowes, LHB Senior Health Education Officer, to bring together a range of people from different groups to work on ways to educate young people on safer sex and achieve the skills necessary to ensure a safe and healthy lifestyle. It is unclear from the records when the working group ended.

9 <u>LHB Health Promotion Department</u>, 1994 – 1997

LHB Health Promotion Department allocated part of their budget to external charities, including to initiatives and campaigns run by Crusaid Scotland.
