

**62 Annual Statistics of Patients, 1854-1864**

Bound volumes giving an annual analysis of cases treated at the Infirmary. The first table gives the types of categories to be considered, with the total number of male and female patients treated for each category of disease; also numbers of cures and of deaths.

Subsequent tables examine the separate categories in more detail, giving breakdowns of numbers according to such factors as age, month of the year, etc.

Individual categories include fevers, nervous diseases, diseases of the respiratory system, and different types of operation.

**65 Patient Statistics, 1860-1973**

Numbers 1–2 below are annual statistical tables of patients under treatment in the wards of the Edinburgh Royal Infirmary. They consist of yearly reports reprinted from ‘Edinburgh Hospital Reports’ printed by Young J Pentland, Edinburgh and London.

These yearly reports are divided into two sections, the report of the medical registrar, and the report of the surgical registrar. Each gives tables analysing the type of disease or injury treated; number of male and female cases of each; result of treatment; length of stay in hospital; mortality rate, etc.

Numbers 3–7 give statistics for particular types of patients, and for specific diseases.

It houses the Works Department, the Blood Transfusion Service, residential accommodation and changing areas for nurses, and various Out-Patient departments.

## ADMISSION OF FEMALE STUDENTS

Letters from the medical and surgical staff to Peter Bell, clerk to the Managers, replying to questions put by the Committee on admission of Female Students to the Infirmary.

The Committee asked the doctors whether they were in favour of admitting female students on the same terms and at the same times as male students, and, if they were not, asked them to suggest an alternative scheme for the training of female students in the Infirmary.

1 Admission of Female Students, 1872

- 1 Patrick Heron Watson, 16 Charlotte Square: in favour, 30 Oct 1872.
- 2 Thomas Annandale, 34 Charlotte Square: against on the grounds that patients would object to being treated by women. Cannot suggest alternative scheme due to the 'flourishing state of the Edinburgh Medical School...and the contracted condition of the Edinburgh Infirmary', 31 Oct 1872.
- 3 George W Balfour, 21 Alva Street: in favour. Refers to Dr Begbie's teaching of a mixed class in the Infirmary, 31 Oct 1872.
- 4 Joseph Bell, 20 Melville Street: against on grounds of decency. Suggests women should train at Chalmers Hospital 'if only it affiliates to itself for teaching purposes one or both of our great parochial hospitals'. 31 Oct 1872.
- 5 J Hughes Bennet, 1 Glenfinlas Street: in favour, 31 Oct 1872.
- 6 J Matthews Duncan, 30 Charlotte Square: against 'on account of my own feeling of impropriety and fear of evil results following'. The male students' opposition to mixed classes would lead to their absence from them. Suggests using certain times of the year in certain wards for the instruction of female students, but feels that the small number of women would make this impractical, 31 Oct 1872.
- 7 Wm Walker, 47 Northumberland Street: against on grounds that mixed classes 'would be repugnant to the feelings of the Patients'. Unable to suggest an alternative scheme, 1 Nov 1872.

- 8 Dr Haldane, 22 Charlotte Square: against. The proposition is ‘inconsistent with all ideas of delicacy’. Suggests two schemes, both of which he feels would be impractical: (a) That a number of beds be set aside for female students, but, due to the already severe pressure of student numbers on too few beds, he feels this would be fatal to the Medical School. (b) Visiting the same patients twice, once with male students; once with female; but feels that due to lack of time on the part of the doctors, and probable objections from patients, this would not work either. 2 Nov 1872.
- 9 T Laycock, university of Edinburgh: against as mixed classes may mean that doctors would be restricted in the performance of their duties both to the patients and to the students; and because the male students are against them. Feels that the only solution is to detach a portion of the buildings to constitute a separate hospital, but feels that pressure of student numbers makes this impractical. Compare RIE’s student numbers with those of Guys, St Bartholemews and the London hospitals. 2 Nov 1872.
- 10 Joseph Lister, 9 Charlotte Square: against, as ‘the reasons which are generally held to make it inexpedient for ladies to attend lectures on medical subjects along with male students in the College class rooms apply with tenfold force against such mixed attendance in the wards in the wards of an hospital’. Unable to suggest an alternative because pressure of numbers would make it impractical to detach 80 beds for instruction of female students, because no doctor could afford the time for a second visit to teach female students; because women house surgeons and physicians would be faced with duties ‘which often tax to the utmost the energies of men’; because the mixing of sexes in the Residency would lead to ‘great inconvenience and scandal’. Feels that the only solution is separate hospitals, but believes ‘it can never be right for young women to study in male wards’. 2 Nov 1872.
- 11 Dr Argyll Robertson, RIE: against because of the restrictions in explanation and examination which mixed classes would place on doctors, and because of probable objections from patients. Cannot suggest an alternative. 2 Nov 1872.
- 12 T Grainger Stewart, 19 Charlotte Square: against on the grounds that no patient ‘of ordinary modesty’ would submit to examination by a mixed class; no doctor ‘of delicacy of feeling’ could conduct the necessary inspection and questioning; and, for the students, studying certain subjects in mixed classes would be ‘blunt that delicacy of feeling which is so important an element of professional character’. No alternative to suggest. 2 Nov 1872.

- 13 John Chiene, 55 Castle Street: against as the complaints of many patients could not be treated satisfactorily in mixed classes. Separate teaching would be impractical as there are already too few beds for the numbers of students attending. 4 Nov 1872.
- 14 James Spence, 21A Ainslie Place: against, as mixed classes would prevent full clinical instruction and would be repulsive to the patients and because the presence of female students in the operating theatre would cause disturbances which may distract the surgeon's attention. Points out that the University Court has enacted that the instruction of women should be conducted in separate classes, and believes that the only method of providing the necessary instruction for women is in a special hospital for the purpose. 6 Nov 1872.
- 15 Thomas R Fraser, 3 Grosvener Street: against, as a thorough examination of many cases would not be possible in a mixed class. No alternative to suggest. 7 Nov 1872.
- 16 John Duncan, 8 Ainslie Place: against the proposal, although not opposed to medical education for women, because of considerations of convenience, delicacy and completeness of teaching. Separate visits to the wards by male and female students would be 'injurious to the patients, and a useless waste of time for the surgeons and physicians'. The detachment of a number of beds for the use of female students would be impractical because the pressure of student numbers was already causing great inconvenience. 11 Nov 1872.
- 17 William R Sanders, 11 Walker Street: against, as, in many cases, a complete investigation could not be conducted before a mixed class 'without such violation of propriety as could not be tolerated'. Separate visits would be objectionable to the patients and too time consuming for the doctors; and the detachment of beds for female teaching would be impractical due to pressure of numbers. 18 Nov 1872.
- 18 Douglas Maclagan, 28 Heriot Row: against, as mixed classes are forbidden by the University, and, even if regulation did permit mixed classes, the presence of women would hamper the proper investigation of many cases. Separate visits to the wards would be injurious to the patients, and the only other alternative, the giving up of the entire Infirmary to female students, and the establishment of another hospital for male students is impractical due to lack of money. 29 Nov 1872.

The RIE Women's Maintenance Council was started in 1938 at the invitation of the Board of Managers of the Hospital. In 1976 the name of the Council was changed to 'The Royal Infirmary of Edinburgh Volunteers'.

The object of the Volunteers is to encourage interest in the work of the RIE and the Simpson Memorial Maternity Pavilion, to enlist the help of those willing to give voluntary personal service and to provide facilities and amenities for patients in addition to those which can be provided by the Hospital.

Services include an Information Desk, a Cafeteria, a snack bar in the Nurses' Home (discontinued in 1984), hospital shops, assistance with library service, making and mending of garments, help in the wards, etc.

These minutes originate from several types of meetings. There are AGM minutes, Executive Committee minutes and Finance Committee minutes. As described, there is also a large amount of detail surrounding the RIE volunteers financial circumstances.

**89 School of Dietetics, 1929–c1990**

The Royal Infirmary of Edinburgh (RIE) established a Dietetic Department in 1924. In 1928 a Diet Kitchen was opened in connection with two wards attached to the clinical laboratory.

The School of Dietetics opened in 1934, offering an 18-month diploma course. Last entrants were received in 1953, the School closing once they had completed the course. The School was also closed for the 1939–1940 session.

This sub-fonds was originally numbered straight through with no series levels. It was recatalogued when Acc 04/14 was added in May 2010. Includes Acc 04/14 – AS 5/2010.

**90     **Massage School / School of Physiotherapy, 1941–1992****

The Infirmary's Massage Department was set up in 1922 in a small room in the Surgical Out-patient Department. Two years later it was transferred, with two part time staff, to a nearby hut.

In 1926 the Radiological Department opened in a new purpose built building. The upper floor was occupied by the 'Massage and Electrical Department'.

In 1943 the 'Chartered Society of Massage and Medical Gymnastics' changed its name to the 'Chartered Society of Physiotherapists'.

When the new department opened in 1926, Miss Mann, formerly of Guy's Hospital, London, became the first Superintendent Physiotherapist.

In April 1941 the School of Massage was inaugurated.

**91 School of Radiography, n.d.**

In 1897 William Rontgen discovered the properties of X-rays. A year later, in 1898, a 'medical electrical department' was introduced in the RIE, housed in a former splints store and plumbers' workshop. In 1904 the department moved to larger premises in the basement of the S E ward block of the surgical house.

By the 1920s X-rays were being used for treatment as well as for diagnosis. As a result a new building was planned to house the department. It opened in 1926.

In 1926 there was no official school of radiography attached to the new department. There was only a 'demonstration room' in the basement where some lectures were given to students who worked as dark-room technicians while studying independently for examinations of the Society of Radiographers which had been founded in 1920.

In 1936 the department was recognised by the Society for teaching purposes. At first a single diploma was awarded, but after 1948 there were separate diplomas for radio-diagnosis and radiotherapy.

After 1955, when the main radiotherapy work was transferred to the Western General Hospital, the school was also divided. There is now the Edinburgh School of Radiotherapy connected with the Western General; and the Edinburgh School of Diagnostic Radiography.

## TRAINING OF NURSES

Before 1872 there was no real training for nurses. Many of the duties that they were required to perform were those of cleaning: scrubbing wards and corridors. The first improvement that was carried out in the Infirmary was the appointment, in 1866, of a superintendent who took over from the housekeeper the job of supervising the nursing staff. In 1872 nursing, as we know it today, was introduced.

After consultation with the Nightingale Fund Committee in London the Infirmary appointed Miss Barclay as the first Lady Superintendent of Nurses. Miss Barclay brought with her from St Thomas's Hospital a party of nurses, known as the 'Nightingales'. A year later ill health forced Miss Barclay to resign her charge, and her assistant, Miss Pringle, was appointed in her place. With the arrival of the Nightingale nurses the Infirmary's Nurses' Training School was born. The different grades of nurse – Staff Nurses, Assistant Nurses and Probationers, with four Assistants Superintendents over them – were established. Ward Assistants relieved nurses of the rougher cleaning jobs.

By the 1930s a Preliminary Training School had been started, and the Nursing School itself provided all the teaching required to satisfy the General Nursing Council's three year syllabus. Infirmary nurses were expected to complete a fourth year. In 1963 a 'wider basic training' syllabus was introduced.
