Introduction

When the HIV infection rate became a significant problem in Edinburgh, Lothian Health Board (LHB) had to take quick, decisive action to try to control the spread of the virus whilst continuing to manage existing services. Dr George Bath led the HIV/AIDS Management Team, who reported to the Chief Administrative Medical Officer (CAMO), later known as the Director of Public Health (DPH), Dr Helen Zealley.

The HIV/AIDS Management Team ordered their files into labelled folders organised by subject, project or group. This arrangement has been reflected in the catalogue where possible. For preservation reasons, contents of some folders have been split into multiple archival-quality folders on account of the size of the originals. This has been documented in the catalogue. Where no title was given for an item or file, one has been estimated (in square brackets).

1 <u>Team management, 1987 – 1998</u>

The HIV/AIDS Management Team reported to the CAMO. The day-to-day work of the Team was managed by George Bath. The team worked closely with the LHB Health Promotion Department to limit the spread of the virus and to raise public awareness of HIV. Reports and records were sent to the Management Team and collected for reference. Unless stated, the Team was not responsible for production of reports or publications.

2 Purchasing, 1992 – 1996

Purchasing was introduced in the early-1990s by the Conservative government to end the provision of services by only one central agency. Purchasing led to purchaser/provider splits, meaning that numerous agencies could bid for contracts to provide services to health boards. Over the years, several committees and working groups discussed how and to whom these contracts should be awarded.

Many of these groups were formed by LHB, but the Team also liaised with outside organisation to ensure a cohesive approach to HIV across Edinburgh.
